Sora Rail Shorebird Workshop

Doug Carson is a multi-award winning carver from Neepawa Manitoba who carves both decorative and working decoys and shorebirds. In this one and a half day workshop, participants will carve, assemble and paint a "flatty-style" traditional hunting decoy, the Sora Rail. Applied wing shapes will bring a three dimensional look to the piece. The painting scheme will be simple, but add distinctive field markings.

Carvers should bring their carving tools (power carving is optional but not necessary). All materials will be supplied by the Instructor.
